

Jeremiah 30

King James Version (KJV)

(Restoration of the Word and of the people)

30 The word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD, saying,

²Thus speaketh the LORD God of Israel, saying, Write thee all the words that I have spoken unto thee in a book. (This is the book)

³For, lo, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will bring again the captivity of my people Israel and Judah, saith the LORD: and I will cause them to return to the land that I gave to their fathers, and they shall possess it. (all 12 tribes) (This will happen during the Millennium, when both houses are re-joined as one)

⁴And these are the words that the LORD spake concerning Israel and concerning Judah.

⁵For thus saith the LORD; We have heard a voice of trembling, of fear, and not of peace. (This would be the Medes and the Persians then; today, the same will repeat itself in the end times when the swarms swarm – the muslims, first, then the Kenites)

⁶Ask ye now, and see whether a man doth travail with child? wherefore do I see every man with his hands on his loins, as a woman in travail, and all faces are turned into paleness? (Men don't give birth; this is concerning the birth of a new age and men's apprehension which precedes it)

⁷Alas! for that day is great, so that none is like it: it is even the time of Jacob's trouble, but he shall be saved out of it. (The tribulation of Satan. We won't be saved by rapture, as the churches preach; we'll be saved from the deception because we know the truth and cannot be deceived by antichrist's ranting)

⁸For it shall come to pass in that day, saith the LORD of hosts, that I will break his yoke from off thy neck, and will burst thy bonds, and strangers shall no more serve themselves of him: (On the Lord's Day, we are all freed)

⁹But they shall serve the LORD their God, and David their king, whom I will raise up unto them. (Jesus returns at the 7th trump as King of kings, Lord of lords; David was just a type for Him)

¹⁰ Therefore fear thou not, O my servant Jacob, saith the LORD; neither be dismayed, O Israel: for, lo, I will save thee from afar, and thy seed from the land of their captivity; and Jacob shall return, and shall be in rest, and be quiet, and none shall make him afraid. (Jacob represents all 12 tribes)

(The millennium – all controversies and vices of the flesh are ended; we are in our spiritual bodies and we will have total recall of the first age)

¹¹ For I am with thee, saith the LORD, to save thee: though I make a full end of all nations whither I have scattered thee, yet I will not make a full end of thee: but I will correct thee in measure, and will not leave thee altogether unpunished. (There will be judgment for all the things that we did. The nations will be ended; but the people will remain)

¹² For thus saith the LORD, Thy bruise is incurable, and thy wound is grievous. (The wound is the mark of the beast – those that were deceived by antichrist)

¹³ There is none to plead thy cause, that thou mayest be bound up: thou hast no healing medicines. (For those that have been deceived by antichrist, there are not many teachers who can teach them the truth of the Word of God)

¹⁴ All thy lovers have forgotten thee; they seek thee not; for I have wounded thee with the wound of an enemy, with the chastisement of a cruel one, for the multitude of thine iniquity; because thy sins were increased. (They bring it on themselves; they never bothered to learn the Word of God; instead, they listened to some preacher who made up doctrine out of his own imagination, and preached it from some pulpit in some church. See verse 2 of this chapter – learn the Word of God)

¹⁵ Why criest thou for thine affliction? thy sorrow is incurable for the multitude of thine iniquity: because thy sins were increased, I have done these things unto thee. (They cry for their misfortune, yet they still refuse to learn the Word of God and live right. God sent misfortune their way because HE is trying to wake them up)

¹⁶ Therefore all they that devour thee shall be devoured; and all thine adversaries, every one of them, shall go into captivity; and they that spoil thee shall be a spoil, and all that prey upon thee will I give for a

prey. (The crooked preachers and corrupt government rulers will be judged for what they have done to the people)

¹⁷ For I will restore health unto thee, and I will heal thee of thy wounds, saith the LORD; because they called thee an Outcast, saying, This is Zion, whom no man seeketh after. (This speaks to the House of Jacob – the 12 tribes. God will heal them and restore them if they repent of their sins)

¹⁸ Thus saith the LORD; Behold, I will bring again the captivity of Jacob's tents, and have mercy on his dwellingplaces; and the city shall be builded upon her own heap, and the palace shall remain after the manner thereof. (The Millennium – Mathew-24 when Jesus told the disciples that there would be not one stone left standing upon another in Jerusalem at the end of this age)

¹⁹ And out of them shall proceed thanksgiving and the voice of them that make merry: and I will multiply them, and they shall not be few; I will also glorify them, and they shall not be small. (In the Millennium)

²⁰ Their children also shall be as aforetime, and their congregation shall be established before me, and I will punish all that oppress them. (These are the people who will learn the Word of God and rejoin His congregation; those who go against God and his people will be chastised)

²¹ And their nobles shall be of themselves, and their governor shall proceed from the midst of them; and I will cause him to draw near, and he shall approach unto me: for who is this that engaged his heart to approach unto me? saith the LORD. (In Ezekiel – these are the Elect, who approach God, and teach the people) (For today, choose your leaders from among your own people. Do not choose leaders from foreign ancestries and cultures that do not share our Christian values, nor worship our God, Yahoveh)

²² And ye shall be my people, and I will be your God.

²³ Behold, the whirlwind of the LORD goeth forth with fury, a continuing whirlwind: it shall fall with pain upon the head of the wicked. (Thank God for justice)

²⁴ The fierce anger of the LORD shall not return, until he hath done it, and until he have performed the intents of his heart: in the latter days

ye shall consider it. (God's plan will be done and no one can prevent it)
