

Psalm 97

King James Version (KJV)

97 The LORD reigneth; let the earth rejoice; let the multitude of isles be glad thereof. (isles- the farthest places on Earth)

²Clouds and darkness are round about him: righteousness and judgment are the habitation of his throne.

³A fire goeth before him, and burneth up his enemies round about.
2Peter-3:10

⁴His lightnings enlightened the world: the earth saw, and trembled.

⁵The hills melted like wax at the presence of the LORD, at the presence of the Lord of the whole earth. (LORD- YAHOVEH, Lord- God as ruler of the Earth)

⁶The heavens declare his righteousness, and all the people see his glory. (On the Lord's Day, every knee will bow...)

⁷Confounded be all they that serve graven images, that boast themselves of idols: worship him, all ye gods. (gods- El-o-Heem-> can also translate to kings, judges and rulers of the earth)

⁸Zion heard, and was glad; and the daughters of Judah rejoiced because of thy judgments, O LORD.

⁹For thou, LORD, art high above all the earth: thou art exalted far above all gods. (gods- El-o-Heem-> can also translate to kings, judges and rulers of the earth)

¹⁰Ye that love the LORD, hate evil: he preserveth the souls of his saints; he delivereth them out of the hand of the wicked.

¹¹Light is sown for the righteous, and gladness for the upright in heart. (righteous- Zadeek, a form of Zadok, the Elect)

¹²Rejoice in the LORD, ye righteous; and give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness.

Ps-93, 97, 99 all begin with the same "The LORD reigneth", and end with holiness.
