Ezekiel 27

King James Version (KJV)

(God addresses Tyrus)

- 27 The word of the LORD came again unto me, saying,
- ²Now, thou son of man, take up a lamentation for Tyrus; (Tyrus=rock; A commercial stronghold of the Kenites) (This chapter likens Tyrus to a fine sailing ship)
- ³ And say unto Tyrus, O thou that art situate at the entry of the sea, which art a merchant of the people for many isles, Thus saith the Lord God; O Tyrus, thou hast said, I am of perfect beauty. (Rich, beautifully adorned center of WW commerce and wealth for the Kenites; they still control the wealth of the global empire, from the shadows)
- ⁴Thy borders are in the midst of the seas, thy builders have perfected thy beauty. (Cain was cursed for killing Able. His descendants cannot farm, so they became builders of cities, merchants, financiers and business people)
- ⁵They have made all thy ship boards of fir trees of Senir: they have taken cedars from Lebanon to make masts for thee. (Senir= snowy or white mountain it also means Lebanon) (The mast drives the ship cedars of Lebanon are a metaphor for God's people; they unwittingly drive the Kenite money machine)
- ⁶Of the oaks of Bashan have they made thine oars; the <u>company</u> of the <u>Ashurites</u> have made thy benches of ivory, brought out of the isles of Chittim. (company = daughters bad translation) (Ashurites= a common box cedar bad translation; the box cedar is symbolic of Satan and the Kenites) (Chiuttum- the bruisers)
- ⁷ Fine linen with broidered work from Egypt was that which thou spreadest forth to be thy sail; blue and purple from the isles of Elishah was that which covered thee. (Their ships are strong and looking good, decked out with the finest things) (See this Elisha in Jeremiah-35, he is a Kenite)
- The inhabitants of Zidon and Arvad were thy mariners: thy wise men, O Tyrus, that were in thee, were thy pilots. (These cities on the mainland supported Tyrus, with food and other supplies)

- The ancients of Gebal and the wise men thereof were in thee thy calkers: all the ships of the sea with their mariners were in thee to occupy thy merchandise. (Gebal= big mountain symbolic for a strong nation) (caulking seals the ship and keeps it afloat; they were hired to support and enable the wealthy Kenite merchants. They serve them in ignorance)
- ¹⁰ They of <u>Persia and of Lud and of Phut</u> were in thine army, thy men of war: they hanged the shield and helmet in thee; they set forth thy comeliness. (Persia, Lud & Phut = Iran and Libya)

(In my opinion, the Kenites used communism to enslave people. They use islam today as their army, to invade and attack Christianity and freedom all over the world. The muslims serve them in ignorance, as the communist did in the past. China is the last communist stronghold and it is still trying to dominate its people and the world)

- ¹¹ The men of Arvad with thine army were upon thy walls round about, and the Gammadims were in thy towers: they hanged their shields upon thy walls round about; they have made thy beauty perfect.

 (Arvad = warning; Gammadims= warriors) (They are a smooth running profit machine, designed to profit from unwitting nations)
- ¹²Tarshish was thy merchant by reason of the multitude of all kind of riches; with silver, iron, tin, and lead, they traded in thy fairs.
- ¹³ Javan, Tubal, and Meshech, they were thy merchants: they traded the persons of men and vessels of brass in thy market. (Javan, Tubal, and Meshech- Esau's children Russia of today) (They were also slave merchants)
- ¹⁴They of the house of Togarmah traded in thy fairs with horses and horsemen and mules. (They traded anything and everything and profited greatly)
- ¹⁵The men of Dedan were thy merchants; many isles were the merchandise of thine hand: they brought thee for a present horns of ivory and ebony. (They traded all the way into Africa as well)
- ¹⁶ Syria was thy merchant by reason of the multitude of the wares of thy making: they occupied in thy fairs with emeralds, purple, and broidered work, and fine linen, and coral, and agate.

- ¹⁷ Judah, and the land of Israel, they were thy merchants: they traded in thy market wheat of Minnith, and Pannag, and honey, and oil, and balm. (Minnith = distributed; Pannag= sweet things from the Palistinians; balm = rosin) (Even Israel was tied up in the Kenite trade machine)
- ¹⁸ Damascus was thy merchant in the multitude of the wares of thy making, for the multitude of all riches; in the wine of Helbon, and white wool. (All the best things that money could buy)
- ¹⁹ Dan also and Javan going to and fro occupied in thy fairs: bright iron, cassia, and calamus, were in thy market. (cassia- what cinnamon comes from) (This area would be in Turkey today)
- ²⁰ Dedan was thy merchant in precious clothes for chariots.
- ²¹ Arabia, and all the princes of Kedar, they occupied with thee in lambs, and rams, and goats: in these were they thy merchants. (Kedar= dark skinned Africans) (These were not sheep herdsmen. They probably had help from the people of southern Egypt, who were distant relatives of the Israelites <shepherd kings>, who raised herds for the Egyptians)
- ²²The merchants of <u>Sheba and Raamah</u>, they were thy merchants: they occupied in thy fairs with chief of all spices, and with all precious stones, and gold. (In Arabia) (Today, they still control most of the world's oil supply)
- ²³ Haran, and Canneh, and Eden, the merchants of Sheba, Asshur, and Chilmad, were thy merchants. (In the region of Mesopotamia in Iraq today)
- ²⁴These were thy merchants in all sorts of things, in blue clothes, and broidered work, and in chests of rich apparel, bound with cords, and made of cedar, among thy merchandise.
- ²⁵ The ships of Tarshish did sing of thee in thy market: and thou wast replenished, and made very glorious in the midst of the seas. (The Kenites built a vast trading empire and got very rich at the expense of other peoples. They are still doing it today, with the global economy and banking system, and people are unaware)

- ²⁶ Thy rowers have brought thee into great waters: the east wind hath broken thee in the midst of the seas. (Thy rowers = their statesmen and diplomats) (The east wind is symbolic for tumult and judgment)
- ²⁷ Thy riches, and thy fairs, thy merchandise, thy mariners, and thy pilots, thy calkers, and the occupiers of thy merchandise, and all thy men of war, that are in thee, and in all thy company which is in the midst of thee, shall fall into the midst of the seas in the day of thy ruin. (God will set things right. He will send a storm to sink their ships)
- ²⁸ The suburbs shall shake at the sound of the cry of thy pilots.
- ²⁹ And all that handle the oar, the mariners, and all the pilots of the sea, shall come down from their ships, they shall stand upon the land;
- ³⁰ And shall cause their voice to be heard against thee, and shall cry bitterly, and shall cast up dust upon their heads, they shall wallow themselves in the ashes: (They will all mourn when their commerce is brought to an end)
- ³¹ And they shall make themselves utterly bald for thee, and gird them with sackcloth, and they shall weep for thee with bitterness of heart and bitter wailing. (They will mourn at the loss of their crooked money making system. They financially enslave the people who work for a living, through corrupt governments and world banking usury. Our own Federal Reserve is part of that crooked system)
- ³² And in their wailing they shall take up a lamentation for thee, and lament over thee, saying, What city is like Tyrus, like the destroyed in the midst of the sea? Revelation-18:18 (It will happen again in the end times to Babylon- which means confusion and is symbolic for Satan's one world system)

(God warns us over and over, and gives us plenty of witnesses. We just don't pay attention)

- ³³ When thy wares went forth out of the seas, thou filledst many people; thou didst enrich the kings of the earth with the multitude of thy riches and of thy merchandise. (Bribes, corruption; the kings and leaders get rich while the people live in poverty and endless payments)
- ³⁴ In the time when thou shalt be broken by the seas in the depths of the waters thy merchandise and all thy company in the midst of thee shall fall. (The whole Kenite system will come down in ruins)

- ³⁵ All the inhabitants of the isles shall be astonished at thee, and their kings shall be sore afraid, they shall be troubled in their countenance. (Because they all were partakers in the system; they thought it was invulnerable)
- ³⁶ The merchants among the people shall hiss at thee; thou shalt be a terror, and never shalt be any more. (They will all turn on the Kenites) (The word hiss is used as an identifier for the serpent and his people. In Hebrew, hiss means to whisper in one's ear, to lie and to deceive)
