

## Psalm 105

King James Version (KJV)

**105** O give thanks unto the LORD; call upon his name: make known his deeds among the people. (people- peoples – plural)

<sup>2</sup> Sing unto him, sing psalms unto him: talk ye of all his wondrous works. (Share knowledge of God with others)

<sup>3</sup> Glory ye in his holy name: let the heart of them rejoice that seek the LORD. 1Chron-28:9 (David's advice to Solomon)

<sup>4</sup> Seek the LORD, and his strength: seek his face evermore. (Continually)

<sup>5</sup> Remember his marvellous works that he hath done; his wonders, and the judgments of his mouth;

<sup>6</sup> O ye seed of Abraham his servant, ye children of Jacob his chosen.

<sup>7</sup> He is the LORD our God: his judgments are in all the earth.

<sup>8</sup> He hath remembered his covenant for ever, the word which he commanded to a thousand generations. (We are about 80 or 90 generations removed from Adam. A thousand generations is very many)

<sup>9</sup> Which covenant he made with Abraham, and his oath unto Isaac;

<sup>10</sup> And confirmed the same unto Jacob for a law, and to Israel for an everlasting covenant: (God changed Jacob's name to Israel)

<sup>11</sup> Saying, Unto thee will I give the land of Canaan, the lot of your inheritance: (Canaanites had mixed with the fallen angels. They were heathen and barbarians. God judged them)

<sup>12</sup> When they were but a few men in number; yea, very few, and strangers in it. (70 went into Egypt – over 2 million came out, 400 years later)

<sup>13</sup> When they went from one nation to another, from one kingdom to another people;

<sup>14</sup> He suffered no man to do them wrong: yea, he reproveth kings for their sakes; (God is in control)

<sup>15</sup> Saying, Touch not mine anointed, and do my prophets no harm.  
(also prophetic for the last days) Zechariah-2:8, Deut-32:10

<sup>16</sup> Moreover he called for a famine upon the land: he brake the whole staff of bread.

<sup>17</sup> He sent a man before them, even Joseph, who was sold for a servant: (HE sent Joseph to Egypt to save His people from famine)

<sup>18</sup> Whose feet they hurt with fetters: he was laid in iron:

<sup>19</sup> Until the time that his word came: the word of the LORD tried him.  
Genesis-41:25 ->

<sup>20</sup> The king sent and loosed him; even the ruler of the people, and let him go free.

<sup>21</sup> He made him lord of his house, and ruler of all his substance:  
(Joseph was made second in Egypt, under pharaoh)

<sup>22</sup> To bind his princes at his pleasure; and teach his senators wisdom.  
(God used Joseph to also save Egypt in the same famine)

<sup>23</sup> Israel also came into Egypt; and Jacob sojourned in the land of Ham.  
(Ham- Egypt)

<sup>24</sup> And he increased his people greatly; and made them stronger than their enemies. (Over 600,000 fighting men, also older men, and all women and children – The total was well over 2 million)

<sup>25</sup> He turned their heart to hate his people, to deal subtilly with his servants. (It was time for Israel to leave Egypt)

<sup>26</sup> He sent Moses his servant; and Aaron whom he had chosen.  
Exodus-3:10

<sup>27</sup> They shewed his signs among them, and wonders in the land of Ham.

<sup>28</sup> He sent darkness, and made it dark; and they rebelled not against his word. Exodus-10:21

<sup>29</sup> He turned their waters into blood, and slew their fish. (This was the first plague – The Nile was their source of survival in Egypt – water and fish) See Ezekiel-29:3

<sup>30</sup> Their land brought forth frogs in abundance, in the chambers of their kings. (The second plague)

<sup>31</sup> He spake, and there came divers sorts of flies, and lice in all their coasts. (coasts- borders) (The fourth plague)

<sup>32</sup> He gave them hail for rain, and flaming fire in their land. (The seventh plague) See Exodus-9:24

<sup>33</sup> He smote their vines also and their fig trees; and brake the trees of their coasts.

<sup>34</sup> He spake, and the locusts came, and caterpillars, and that without number, (The eighth plague) Also a prophecy of the locust army of Revelation-9

<sup>35</sup> And did eat up all the herbs in their land, and devoured the fruit of their ground.

<sup>36</sup> He smote also all the firstborn in their land, the chief of all their strength. (The firstborn was seen as proof of a man's vigor and strength) (The tenth and last plague – The first Passover)

<sup>37</sup> He brought them forth also with silver and gold: and there was not one feeble person among their tribes. (They left Egypt with dignity, not sneaking away) Exodus-12:35 -> (Bad translation. They didn't borrow gold. They were owed it for 400 years of labor)

<sup>38</sup> Egypt was glad when they departed: for the fear of them fell upon them. (They will know that I Am the LORD)

<sup>39</sup> He spread a cloud for a covering; and fire to give light in the night. (God went before Israel in the wilderness)

<sup>40</sup> The people asked, and he brought quails, and satisfied them with the bread of heaven. (Manna – angel's food) (Symbolic for the Bread of Life – Spiritually)

<sup>41</sup> He opened the rock, and the waters gushed out; they ran in the dry places like a river.

<sup>42</sup> For he remembered his holy promise, and Abraham his servant.

<sup>43</sup> And he brought forth his people with joy, and his chosen with gladness: (gladness- singing)

<sup>44</sup> And gave them the lands of the heathen: and they inherited the labour of the people; (The Canaanites – heathen children of the fallen angels) see Deuteronomy-6:11

<sup>45</sup> That they might observe his statutes, and keep his laws. Praise ye the LORD. (They were blessed while they kept God's statutes and laws. Later, they became a nation of heathen, and were on their own. This led to Israel's downfall.) (Look around the US, today. Where are we headed? )
