

Jeremiah 25

King James Version (KJV)

25 The word that came to Jeremiah concerning all the people of Judah in the fourth year of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah king of Judah, that was the first year of Nebuchadrezzar king of Babylon; (Jehoiakim, an evil king only ruled 3 months, and was succeeded by Jehoiakin, and later, Zedekiah)

²The which Jeremiah the prophet spake unto all the people of Judah, and to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, saying,

³From the thirteenth year of Josiah the son of Amon king of Judah, even unto this day, that is the three and twentieth year, the word of the LORD hath come unto me, and I have spoken unto you, rising early and speaking; but ye have not hearkened. (No one wanted to hear what Jeremiah had to say, for 23 years. They mocked him and persecuted him)

⁴And the LORD hath sent unto you all his servants the prophets, rising early and sending them; but ye have not hearkened, nor inclined your ear to hear.

⁵They said, Turn ye again now every one from his evil way, and from the evil of your doings, and dwell in the land that the LORD hath given unto you and to your fathers for ever and ever:

⁶And go not after other gods to serve them, and to worship them, and provoke me not to anger with the works of your hands; and I will do you no hurt.

(Today, we have atheists, agnostics and even the so-called Christians celebrate Easter – a pagan fertility festival worshipping Ishtar, the pagan goddess of heaven. Easter was brought into the church by the early popes to replace Passover. They wanted to bring in the heathen to increase the membership of the church to make more tithe money)

⁷Yet ye have not hearkened unto me, saith the LORD; that ye might provoke me to anger with the works of your hands to your own hurt. (They did it to themselves, over and over; they never learned)

⁸Therefore thus saith the LORD of hosts; Because ye have not heard my words, (Judgment has come for them)

⁹ Behold, I will send and take all the families of the north, saith the LORD, and Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon, my servant, and will bring them against this land, and against the inhabitants thereof, and against all these nations round about, and will utterly destroy them, and make them an astonishment, and an hissing, and perpetual desolations. (Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon, my servant – God sent Nebuchadnezzar to chastise Israel for their endless sins) (The surrounding nations were also destroyed because of the pervasive perversions on the Canaanites and other tribes that had infiltrated Israel. God sent Nebuchadnezzar to clean out the whole area)

(200 years earlier, the Assyrians took the ten northern tribes captive; and they were eventually dispersed over the Caucasus Mountains into Europe. They became known as Caucasians) (Here, Nebuchadnezzar took Judah and Benjamin)

¹⁰ Moreover I will take from them the voice of mirth, and the voice of gladness, the voice of the bridegroom, and the voice of the bride, the sound of the millstones, and the light of the candle. Revelation-18:23

¹¹ And this whole land shall be a desolation, and an astonishment; and these nations shall serve the king of Babylon seventy years. (Cyrus, of Persia let them return to Jerusalem 70 years after Nebuchadnezzar took them captive)

¹² And it shall come to pass, when seventy years are accomplished, that I will punish the king of Babylon, and that nation, saith the LORD, for their iniquity, and the land of the Chaldeans, and will make it perpetual desolations. (This is Iraq, today)

¹³ And I will bring upon that land all my words which I have pronounced against it, even all that is written in this book, which Jeremiah hath prophesied against all the nations.

¹⁴ For many nations and great kings shall serve themselves of them also: and I will recompense them according to their deeds, and according to the works of their own hands. (They will all get what they deserve – including Europe and the US, where the 10 tribes ended up. They are doing everything they can to remove God out of their cultures for political correctness) Revelation-18:3-6

¹⁵ For thus saith the LORD God of Israel unto me; Take the wine cup of this fury at my hand, and cause all the nations, to whom I send thee, to drink it. (This will be the cup of God's wrath, poured out onto those

who deserve it. This is the cup Jesus asked that might pass from Him. He will pour it out on those who deserve it. Many people think Jesus was asking mercy for Himself. He was asking mercy for the people.)

¹⁶ And they shall drink, and be moved, and be mad, because of the sword that I will send among them.

¹⁷ Then took I the cup at the LORD's hand, and made all the nations to drink, unto whom the LORD had sent me: (This verse is prophecy for the end times)

¹⁸ To wit, Jerusalem, and the cities of Judah, and the kings thereof, and the princes thereof, to make them a desolation, an astonishment, an hissing, and a curse; as it is this day; (This judgment is to the leaders who led the people to sin)

¹⁹ Pharaoh king of Egypt, and his servants, and his princes, and all his people; (The leaders who helped caused Israel to fail)

²⁰ And all the mingled people, and all the kings of the land of Uz, and all the kings of the land of the Philistines, and Ashkelon, and Azzah, and Ekron, and the remnant of Ashdod, (The Palestinians, the Gaza Strip, Lebanon, Arab Muslims of today, who persecute and kill Jews and Christians)

²¹ Edom, and Moab, and the children of Ammon, (This Russia today <Edom means red>, Ammon and Moab are Jordan)

²² And all the kings of Tyrus, and all the kings of Zidon, and the kings of the isles which are beyond the sea, (These are the Kenites. Tyrus was a rocky island in the Med where merchants made huge profits, and Zidon was the city on the coast that gave them the support they needed – food, and other commodities that they couldn't provide for themselves. Today the Kenites have infiltrated pretty much all of the western civilization in Europe and America)

²³ Dedan, and Tema, and Buz, and all that are in the utmost corners, (Dedan, Tema and Buz are in Saudi Arabia today;)

²⁴ And all the kings of Arabia, and all the kings of the mingled people that dwell in the desert, (Saudi Arabia, Yemen, Qatar, UAE, Turkey, Syria; also included in this may be north African muslim nations – Libya, etc.)

²⁵ And all the kings of Zimri, and all the kings of Elam, and all the kings of the Medes, (Iran and their allies)

²⁶ And all the kings of the north, far and near, one with another, and all the kingdoms of the world, which are upon the face of the earth: and the king of Sheshach shall drink after them.

(Sheshach-> a cipher in the Hebrew manuscripts – reverses the order of the letters of the Hebrew alphabet - <sh, sh, ch -> B, B, L = Babel or Babylon; the king of Babylon is a type for antichrist; antichrist <Satan> will deceive the whole world in the end times. He will also drink of the cup of God's wrath. This is outlined in the Masarah)

Second reference – (The city "Sheshach" does not appear on any map nor in any other documents, save the book of Jeremiah. The Atbash Cipher was applied and out of "Sheshach" came the word "Babel". This is supposed to be confirmed by a reference to Jeremiah 51:41, where Sheshach and Babylon are in parallel clauses. A similar instance of this Hebrew cryptographic method occurs in Jeremiah 51:1, where Leb Kamai is code for Chaldea.)

²⁷ Therefore thou shalt say unto them, Thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel; Drink ye, and be drunken, and spue, and fall, and rise no more, because of the sword which I will send among you. (spue= vomit) Revelation-1:15-16 (the sword is the Word of God that proceeds out of His mouth. The truth is their judge)

²⁸ And it shall be, if they refuse to take the cup at thine hand to drink, then shalt thou say unto them, Thus saith the LORD of hosts; Ye shall certainly drink. (God will not give them a choice. They will be judged)

²⁹ For, lo, I begin to bring evil on the city which is called by my name, and should ye be utterly unpunished? Ye shall not be unpunished: for I will call for a sword upon all the inhabitants of the earth, saith the LORD of hosts. (This is Jerusalem)

³⁰ Therefore prophesy thou against them all these words, and say unto them, The LORD shall roar from on high, and utter his voice from his holy habitation; he shall mightily roar upon his habitation; he shall give a shout, as they that tread the grapes, against all the inhabitants of the earth.

³¹ A noise shall come even to the ends of the earth; for the LORD hath a controversy with the nations, he will plead with all flesh; he will give them that are wicked to the sword, saith the LORD. (People will get

what they deserve; we all create our own fate by how we live in the flesh) Revelation-1:15-16 (The sword of the Lord is His Word which proceeds out of his mouth. The truth is undeniable and undisputable)

³² Thus saith the LORD of hosts, Behold, evil shall go forth from nation to nation, and a great whirlwind shall be raised up from the coasts of the earth. (Ever increasing storms)

³³ And the slain of the LORD shall be at that day from one end of the earth even unto the other end of the earth: they shall not be lamented, neither gathered, nor buried; they shall be dung upon the ground. (The instant that Jesus returns, all flesh dies in the blink of an eye. All people are in their spiritual bodies in an instant)

³⁴ Howl, ye shepherds, and cry; and wallow yourselves in the ashes, ye principal of the flock: for the days of your slaughter and of your dispersions are accomplished; and ye shall fall like a pleasant vessel. (These fake priests think they can con God; they're in for a rude awakening; they'll plead and think that their false doctrines will be "good enough" for God to accept. HE won't. They were sent to teach God's Word- unchanged. They failed by teaching traditions of men and doctrines of churches)

³⁵ And the shepherds shall have no way to flee, nor the principal of the flock to escape. (They won't be able to talk their way out of judgment)

³⁶ A voice of the cry of the shepherds, and an howling of the principal of the flock, shall be heard: for the LORD hath spoiled their pasture. (Pastors are keepers of the pasture- to feed the sheep; here, it is metaphorical for teaching the true Word of God; Instead of teaching God's Word, they write "sermons" out of their own imagination)

³⁷ And the peaceable habitations are cut down because of the fierce anger of the LORD. (God holds the preachers accountable for teaching false doctrine and traditions of men. The people they misled are in danger of losing their souls)

³⁸ He hath forsaken his covert, as the lion: for their land is desolate because of the fierceness of the oppressor, and because of his fierce anger. (The sword of the Lord will execute judgment, whether the fake preachers like it or not)
