

Hebrews 1

King James Version (KJV)

(By: Paul – Penned by Timothy for Paul)

Genesis-14:13 (Hebrews – crossed over, from beyond the river; those who had crossed the River Euphrates)

1 God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, (God sent prophet after prophet to teach the people)

²Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds; (worlds= Eons - Ages, time periods) (Son = His begotten; God in the flesh; Jesus is one of God's many offices)

³Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high: **Psalms-110**

⁴Being made so much better than the angels, as he hath by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they. (HE was God, in the flesh; not His Son; as so many preachers teach. One God, many offices)

⁵For unto which of the angels said he at any time, Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee? And again, I will be to him a Father, and he shall be to me a Son? **Psalms-2:7** (This is as people wrote about Jesus. Jesus was God, in the flesh. Jesus Himself said – If you've seen me, you've seen the father)

⁶And again, when he bringeth in the first begotten into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God worship him. (This is Jesus)

Genesis- (God said - Let us make man in our image. Jesus is God in the flesh)

⁷And of the angels he saith, Who maketh his angels spirits, and his ministers a flame of fire. **Psalms-104**

⁸But unto the Son he saith, Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever: a sceptre of righteousness is the sceptre of thy kingdom. (Who better to judge man than God in the flesh; who lived as a man?)

⁹Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; therefore God, even thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows. (Jesus lived a perfect life; without any sin. Christ <Christos – Greek> means the anointed one)

(NOTE: The word anointed comes from the root word which means to rub with oil. Which oil? Olive oil < El o Yah - Hebrew> God's names)

¹⁰And, Thou, Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundation of the earth; and the heavens are the works of thine hands: Genesis-1:1, John-1:1

¹¹They shall perish; but thou remainest; and they all shall wax old as doth a garment; (The universe will eventually end, but God is forever)

¹²And as a vesture shalt thou fold them up, and they shall be changed: but thou art the same, and thy years shall not fail. (God was the same in the past, as He is today; and He will be forever)

¹³But to which of the angels said he at any time, Sit on my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool? (This place is reserved for Jesus. In the end times, the Elect will make His enemies His footstool. They will witness before antichrist, and the Holy Spirit will speak through them) see Mark-13

¹⁴Are they not all ministering spirits, sent forth to minister for them who shall be heirs of salvation? (The angels are people who are now in their spiritual bodies. These are people who have already lived and died in the flesh, or have not been born yet. We only pass through the flesh)
