**Psalm 59** Mich-tam of David, when Saul sent, and they watched the house to kill him

King James Version (KJV) (Mich-tam – To cut into or engrave in your mind)

- **59** Deliver me from mine enemies, O my God: defend me from them that rise up against me.
- <sup>2</sup>Deliver me from the workers of iniquity, and save me from bloody men.
- <sup>3</sup> For, lo, they lie in wait for my soul: the mighty are gathered against me; not for my transgression, nor for my sin, O LORD. (David had done nothing against Saul)
- <sup>4</sup>They run and prepare themselves without my fault: awake to help me, and behold.
- <sup>5</sup>Thou therefore, O LORD God of hosts, the God of Israel, awake to visit all the heathen: be not merciful to any wicked transgressors. Selah.
- <sup>6</sup>They return at evening: they make a noise like a dog, and go round about the city. (They act under the cover of darkness)
- <sup>7</sup>Behold, they <u>belch</u> out with their mouth: swords are in their lips: for who, say they, doth hear? (belch= foam, like rabid dogs)
- \*But thou, O LORD, shalt laugh at them; thou shalt have all the heathen in derision. See Psalm 2
- <sup>9</sup>Because of his strength will I wait upon thee: for God is my defense. (Vengence belongs to God)
- <sup>10</sup> The God of my mercy shall prevent me: God shall let me see my desire upon mine enemies.
- <sup>11</sup> Slay them not, lest my people forget: scatter them by thy power; and bring them down, O Lord our shield.
- <sup>12</sup> For the sin of their mouth and the words of their lips let them even be taken in their pride: and for cursing and lying which they speak. (and was added in English)

- <sup>13</sup> Consume them in wrath, consume them, that they may not be: and let them know that God ruleth in Jacob unto the ends of the earth. Selah. (Let the people see their judgment)
- <sup>14</sup> And at evening let them return; and let them make a noise like a dog, and go round about the city.
- <sup>15</sup> Let them wander up and down for meat, and grudge if they be not satisfied.
- <sup>16</sup> But I will sing of thy power; yea, I will sing aloud of thy mercy in the morning: for thou hast been my defense and refuge in the day of my trouble.
- <sup>17</sup> Unto thee, O my strength, will I sing: for God is my defense, and the God of my mercy.

To the chief musician upon Shu-shan-e-duth (testimony – at the second Passover for those who could not attend the first)

David's wife, Mical, helped him escape Saul's murder attempt. When Saul's men came for him, he had fled.
