Psalm 58 Mich-tam of David

King James Version (KJV) (Mich-tam – To cut into or engrave in your mind)

- **58** Do ye indeed speak righteousness, O <u>congregation</u>? do ye judge uprightly, O ye sons of men? (congregation= silence or mute justice -> Bad translation here in the KJV)
- ²Yea, in heart ye work wickedness; ye weigh the violence of your hands in the earth. (David speaks against Absalom)
- ³The wicked are estranged from the womb: they go astray as soon as they be born, speaking lies.
- ⁴Their poison is like the poison of a serpent: they are like the deaf adder that stoppeth her ear; (Serpent is a type for Satan)
- ⁵ Which will not hearken to the voice of charmers, <u>charming never so</u> <u>wisely.</u> (Translation -> even if the charmer is talented and wise)
- ⁶Break their teeth, O God, in their mouth: break out the great teeth of the young lions, O LORD. (David asking for vengeance)
- Let them melt away as waters which run continually: when he bendeth his bow to shoot his arrows, let them be as cut in pieces.
- ⁸ As a snail which melteth, let every one of them pass away: like the untimely birth of a woman, that they may not see the sun.
- ⁹Before your pots can feel the thorns, he shall take them away as with a whirlwind, both living, and in his wrath.
- ¹⁰ The righteous shall rejoice when he seeth the vengeance: he shall wash his feet in the blood of the wicked. (At judgment day)
- ¹¹ So that a man shall say, Verily there is a reward for the righteous: verily he is a God that judgeth in the earth. (Only God judges righteously not man)

To the chief musician, Al-tas-chith (Destroy not)

Amnon raped Tamar, and Absalom killed him for it. He was then a fugitive for 2 years – wrongly. When he returned, he turned on David, and usurped the throne. David fled, rather than starting a civil war in Jerusalem. Both men wrongly judged the other – David and Absalom
