

2 Chronicles 12

King James Version (KJV)

12 And it came to pass, when Rehoboam had established the kingdom, and had strengthened himself, he forsook the law of the LORD, and all Israel with him. **1Kings-14:22-24 (Idolatry, sodomy, grove orgies and other perversions) (Once Rehoboam got what he wanted, he abandoned God. He was as bad as his father, Solomon)**

(Learn God's Word and stay in His law and He will bless you and keep you strong and well. If you abandon God, He will abandon you. Without God's wisdom and His protection, the world will eat you up)

²And it came to pass, that in the fifth year of king Rehoboam, Shishak king of Egypt came up against Jerusalem, because they had transgressed against the LORD, **(This happened over and over in the history of Israel. They never learned. All they had to do was to stay true to God and live by God's law, and they would have remained strong and free)**

(Shishak was the first king of the 22nd dynasty of Egypt)

³With twelve hundred chariots, and threescore thousand horsemen: and the people were without number that came with him out of Egypt; the Lubims, the Sukkiims, and the Ethiopians. **(Lubims - Lybians; Sukkims - hut dwellers) (The world had heard of the wealth of Solomon, and they wanted it. These three nations were long time allies of Egypt)**

⁴And he took the fenced cities which pertained to Judah, and came to Jerusalem.

⁵Then came Shemaiah the prophet to Rehoboam, and to the princes of Judah, that were gathered together to Jerusalem because of Shishak, and said unto them, Thus saith the LORD, Ye have forsaken me, and therefore have I also left you in the hand of Shishak. **Exodus-34:14**

⁶Whereupon the princes of Israel and the king humbled themselves; and they said, The LORD is righteous. **(They knew that they were guilty, so they repented)**

⁷And when the LORD saw that they humbled themselves, the word of the LORD came to Shemaiah, saying, They have humbled themselves; therefore I will not destroy them, but I will grant them some

deliverance; and my wrath shall not be poured out upon Jerusalem by the hand of Shishak. (Some deliverance only; they will need to earn God's trust back)

⁸ Nevertheless they shall be his servants; that they may know my service, and the service of the kingdoms of the countries. (After they get a taste of man's oppression, they will see how easy it is to live by God's laws)

⁹ So Shishak king of Egypt came up against Jerusalem, and took away the treasures of the house of the LORD, and the treasures of the king's house; he took all: he carried away also the shields of gold which Solomon had made. (Shishak stripped their wealth bare)

¹⁰ Instead of which king Rehoboam made shields of brass, and committed them to the hands of the chief of the guard, that kept the entrance of the king's house.

¹¹ And when the king entered into the house of the LORD, the guard came and fetched them, and brought them again into the guard chamber. (Rehoboam enjoyed the pompous ceremonial stuff – a good look into his character. That is why God took his riches away)

¹² And when he humbled himself, the wrath of the LORD turned from him, that he would not destroy him altogether: and also in Judah things went well. (There were still many people in Judah that remained faithful to God)

(As corrupt as the US government is today, there are many Americans who love and serve God. Although the leftists are trying to persecute us, we will remain strong and faithful to God. God knows who we are)

¹³ So king Rehoboam strengthened himself in Jerusalem, and reigned: for Rehoboam was one and forty years old when he began to reign, and he reigned seventeen years in Jerusalem, the city which the LORD had chosen out of all the tribes of Israel, to put his name there. And his mother's name was Naamah an Ammonitess. (A descendant of Ammon)

(Meanwhile, under Jeroboam, the 10 northern tribes had completely abandoned God. They worshipped the golden calves and other heathen idols)

¹⁴ And he did evil, because he prepared not his heart to seek the LORD. (prepared = fixed or established) (He was a pathetic king so he only reigned 17 years) See 1Chronicles-28:9 (David's advice to Solomon)

¹⁵ Now the acts of Rehoboam, first and last, are they not written in the book of Shemaiah the prophet, and of Iddo the seer concerning genealogies? And there were wars between Rehoboam and Jeroboam continually. (book of Shemaiah – words of Shemaiah - written into this book of Chronicles) (wars - border skirmishes and general hostilities; Rehoboam never got over the loss of the 10 northern tribes to Jeroboam)

¹⁶ And Rehoboam slept with his fathers, and was buried in the city of David: and Abijah his son reigned in his stead.
