King James Version (KJV)

9 And as Jesus passed by, he saw a man which was blind from his birth.

² And his disciples asked him, saying, Master, who did sin, this man, or his parents, that he was born blind? (They think his blindness is some kind of punishment)

³ Jesus answered, Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the works of God should be made manifest in him. (God chose him to be an example to people. When Jesus heals him, people will open their spiritual eyes. His witness for God even goes on today to all who read this Book)

⁴ I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work. (The night spoken of here, will be the tribulation of antichrist in the end days. Hee will control the world for a short period)

⁵ As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world. (Light conquers the confusion of darkness. The truth of God's Word conquers ignorance and confusion)

⁶ When he had thus spoken, he spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and he anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay,

⁷ And said unto him, Go, wash in the pool of Siloam, (which is by interpretation, Sent.) He went his way therefore, and washed, and came seeing. (This pool originates at the fountain of the virgin. The clay is symbolic for our flesh bodies. God can heal whoever He will. Jesus is the living water, born from the virgin, Mary) Isaiah-7:14

⁸ The neighbours therefore, and they which before had seen him that he was blind, said, Is not this he that sat and begged? (They knew he was blind from birth, so this was no deception)

⁹ Some said, This is he: others said, He is like him: but he said, I am he.

¹⁰ Therefore said they unto him, How were thine eyes opened? (By miracle of God)

¹¹ He answered and said, A man that is called Jesus made clay, and anointed mine eyes, and said unto me, Go to the pool of Siloam, and wash: and I went and washed, and I received sight. (He had faith and did as Jesus told him)

¹² Then said they unto him, Where is he? He said, I know not.

¹³ They brought to the Pharisees him that aforetime was blind.

¹⁴ And it was the sabbath day when Jesus made the clay, and opened his eyes. (Jesus healed the man on the Sabbath day. They will use this as an excuse to go after Jesus. They had already decided to kill Him. They just needed an excuse)

¹⁵ Then again the Pharisees also asked him how he had received his sight. He said unto them, He put clay upon mine eyes, and I washed, and do see.

¹⁶ Therefore said some of the Pharisees, This man is not of God, because he keepeth not the sabbath day. Others said, How can a man that is a sinner do such miracles? And there was a division among them. (The truth will always divide. How can an evil man do the works of God? He can't. Obviously, He is not an evil man. These Pharisees are just a bunch of murdering Kenites)

¹⁷ They say unto the blind man again, What sayest thou of him, that he hath opened thine eyes? He said, He is a prophet. Genesis-49:10

¹⁸ But the Jews did not believe concerning him, that he had been blind, and received his sight, until they called the parents of him that had received his sight. (There are always Kenites in the group, to stir up trouble)

¹⁹ And they asked them, saying, Is this your son, who ye say was born blind? how then doth he now see?

²⁰ His parents answered them and said, We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind: (Second witnesses to Jesus' miracle healing)

²¹ But by what means he now seeth, we know not; or who hath opened his eyes, we know not: he is of age; ask him: he shall speak for himself. (The Pharisees tried to intimidate any witnesses to Jesus.

They probably threatened to throw them out of the synagogue. They would have been doing them a favor)

²² These words spake his parents, because they feared the Jews: for the Jews had agreed already, that if any man did confess that he was Christ, he should be put out of the synagogue. (Excommunication)

²³ Therefore said his parents, He is of age; ask him.

²⁴ Then again called they the man that was blind, and said unto him, Give God the praise: we know that this man is a sinner.

²⁵ He answered and said, Whether he be a sinner or no, I know not: one thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see. (The proof is in the work of Jesus, not in the words of these fakes)

²⁶ Then said they to him again, What did he to thee? how opened he thine eyes? (They couldn't do it even if they were told how Jesus did it)

²⁷ He answered them, I have told you already, and ye did not hear: wherefore would ye hear it again? will ye also be his disciples? (He just put them on notice)

²⁸ Then they reviled him, and said, Thou art his disciple; but we are Moses' disciples.

²⁹ We know that God spake unto Moses: as for this fellow, we know not from whence he is. Deuteronomy-18:15-18 (They were not Moses' disciples. They were a bunch of Kenites, pretending to be of Judas)

³⁰ The man answered and said unto them, Why herein is a marvellous thing, that ye know not from whence he is, and yet he hath opened mine eyes. (If they were of Moses, they would know that the coming of Messiah was prophesied by many prophets in many Books. They are just a bunch of liars)

³¹ Now we know that God heareth not sinners: but if any man be a worshipper of God, and doeth his will, him he heareth. (Again, the proof is in the miracles that Jesus performed)

³² Since the world began was it not heard that any man opened the eyes of one that was born blind. (This should have been proof enough to convince them that they were looking right at Messiah)

³³ If this man were not of God, he could do nothing. (Jesus opened his flesh eyes and also his spiritual eyes. He knew that God had just blessed him)

³⁴ They answered and said unto him, Thou wast altogether born in sins, and dost thou teach us? And they cast him out. (Best thing that ever happened to him. Why would anyone want to belong to a church operated by this bunch of fakes? They were money grubbing murderers in priests' robes)

³⁵ Jesus heard that they had cast him out; and when he had found him, he said unto him, Dost thou believe on the Son of God?

³⁶ He answered and said, Who is he, Lord, that I might believe on him? (Jesus had healed him while he was still blind. It was only after he washed his eyes that he could see)

³⁷ And Jesus said unto him, Thou hast both seen him, and it is he that talketh with thee. (Open your eyes. The miracle is your proof)

³⁸ And he said, Lord, I believe. And he worshipped him. (God pre-ordained him to be a witness for himself, the people around him and for everyone who reads this chapter)

(Just as God pre-ordained the Elect to stand against antichrist in the end days. They will be a witness for God, before the whole world. Many people will wake up out of their stupor and be saved by their testimony. This will be the downfall of antichrist)

³⁹ And Jesus said, For judgment I am come into this world, that they which see not might see; and that they which see might be made blind.

⁴⁰ And some of the Pharisees which were with him heard these words, and said unto him, Are we blind also? (Yes - spiritually)

⁴¹ Jesus said unto them, If ye were blind, ye should have no sin: but now ye say, We see; therefore your sin remaineth. (You claim to be able to see spiritually, yet you reject Jesus, so yes, you sin)
