

John 6

King James Version (KJV)

6 After these things Jesus went over the sea of Galilee, which is the sea of Tiberias.

²And a great multitude followed him, because they saw his miracles which he did on them that were diseased. (He did this to prove to the people that He was the true Messiah. Afterwards, He would teach them God's Word)

³And Jesus went up into a mountain, and there he sat with his disciples.

⁴And the passover, a feast of the Jews, was nigh.

⁵When Jesus then lifted up his eyes, and saw a great company come unto him, he saith unto Philip, Whence shall we buy bread, that these may eat?

⁶And this he said to prove him: for he himself knew what he would do. (Jesus was testing Philip, to see if he understood)

⁷Philip answered him, Two hundred pennyworth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one of them may take a little. (Philip didn't get it. This was God with us. HE could feed the whole world if He wanted to – both of bread for the flesh and in spiritual healing for the soul)

⁸One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, saith unto him,

⁹There is a lad here, which hath five barley loaves, and two small fishes: but what are they among so many? (Barley=poor man's bread; fishes – the letters in the Greek word fish make up a Greek cipher-> Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior)

¹⁰And Jesus said, Make the men sit down. Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, in number about five thousand. (Jesus never catered to a mob. HE made them sit down and had the disciples feed them in an orderly fashion. God wants us to feed the Word to other people just as He did then)

¹¹And Jesus took the loaves; and when he had given thanks, he distributed to the disciples, and the disciples to them that were set

down; and likewise of the fishes as much as they would. (Always thank God for what He provides. Jesus taught by example)

¹² When they were filled, he said unto his disciples, Gather up the fragments that remain, that nothing be lost.

¹³ Therefore they gathered them together, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves, which remained over and above unto them that had eaten. Matthew-16:6-12 (The crumbs that Jesus spoke of was the false teachings and denominations of priests, not of God. When you have a large meeting, some will always slip in to spread their own made up doctrines)

¹⁴ Then those men, when they had seen the miracle that Jesus did, said, This is of a truth that prophet that should come into the world.

¹⁵ When Jesus therefore perceived that they would come and take him by force, to make him a king, he departed again into a mountain himself alone. (So He could feed them fish sandwiches. Jesus wasn't here to take a worldly throne against Caesar. He was here to establish His church for this Age the next Age)

¹⁶ And when even was now come, his disciples went down unto the sea,

¹⁷ And entered into a ship, and went over the sea toward Capernaum. And it was now dark, and Jesus was not come to them.

¹⁸ And the sea arose by reason of a great wind that blew.

¹⁹ So when they had rowed about five and twenty or thirty furlongs, they see Jesus walking on the sea, and drawing nigh unto the ship: and they were afraid. (See Matthew-14:22-33 for a better explanation of exactly what happened)

²⁰ But he saith unto them, It is I; be not afraid.

²¹ Then they willingly received him into the ship: and immediately the ship was at the land whither they went. 1Corinthian-10:13 (Jesus' promise to us)

²² The day following, when the people which stood on the other side of the sea saw that there was none other boat there, save that one where into his disciples were entered, and that Jesus went not with his disciples into the boat, but that his disciples were gone away alone;

²³ (Howbeit there came other boats from Tiberias nigh unto the place where they did eat bread, after that the Lord had given thanks:)

²⁴ When the people therefore saw that Jesus was not there, neither his disciples, they also took shipping, and came to Capernaum, seeking for Jesus.

²⁵ And when they had found him on the other side of the sea, they said unto him, Rabbi, when camest thou hither? (They didn't see Him get on the boat with the disciples. He walked on the water to the boat)

²⁶ Jesus answered them and said, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Ye seek me, not because ye saw the miracles, but because ye did eat of the loaves, and were filled. (They were only after fish sandwiches)

²⁷ Labour not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life, which the Son of man shall give unto you: for him hath God the Father sealed. (Seek not food for the flesh; seek spiritual food for the soul) (sealed - These are also elect; God sealed His Word into their minds) Revelation-9:4

²⁸ Then said they unto him, What shall we do, that we might work the works of God?

²⁹ Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God, that ye believe on him whom he hath sent. Isaiah-7:14 (Jesus made it really easy for us – believe Him and obey His commandments)

³⁰ They said therefore unto him, What sign shewest thou then, that we may see, and believe thee? what dost thou work? (They just saw miracles, and yet they ask for a sign. Their spiritual eyes are closed)

³¹ Our fathers did eat manna in the desert; as it is written, He gave them bread from heaven to eat. Exodus-16:15

³² Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Moses gave you not that bread from heaven; but my Father giveth you the true bread from heaven. (Today, Jesus is the bread of life; God's Word feeds out soul and gives us everlasting life)

³³ For the bread of God is he which cometh down from heaven, and giveth life unto the world. (Manna fed the flesh; God's Word feeds the soul)

³⁴ Then said they unto him, Lord, evermore give us this bread. (They just wanted another fish sandwich. They just didn't get what Jesus was teaching)

³⁵ And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst. (Knowledge of the Word of God will nourish the soul permanently)

³⁶ But I said unto you, That ye also have seen me, and believe not. (That's the problem. They refused to believe Jesus, in spite of the miracles that they had witnessed)

³⁷ All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out. (The Elect are given. They were chosen in the First Age because they remained loyal to God when Satan rebelled (see Catabole>. The free will people didn't. They need to choose God in this Age. HE will not influence them one way or the other. They need to come to God voluntarily)

³⁸ For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me. (Pray in God's will, and not your own. God knows what you need. Jesus taught by example)

³⁹ And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day. (raise it up- resurrect) (The Elect stood with God in the First Age, and they will stand with Him again when antichrist is here, deceiving the whole world)

⁴⁰ And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day. (The first resurrection stated in Revelation, when Jesus returns as King of kings, Lord of lords. Those that are loyal to Him will be a part of the First Resurrection)
Revelation-20:1-6

⁴¹ The Jews then murmured at him, because he said, I am the bread which came down from heaven. (These Jews are Kenites in the crowd)

⁴² And they said, Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? how is it then that he saith, I came down from heaven? (Joseph was not Jesus' father. He was His step father) (Also, we all came down from Heaven, from the First Age, through the flesh

of the Second Age, and then will return to paradise in the spirit after we die)

⁴³ Jesus therefore answered and said unto them, Murmur not among yourselves.

⁴⁴ No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him: and I will raise him up at the last day. (God will draw the Elect in the last days to testify against antichrist before the whole world)

⁴⁵ It is written in the prophets, And they shall be all taught of God. Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me. **Isaiah-54:13**

⁴⁶ Not that any man hath seen the Father, save he which is of God, he hath seen the Father.

⁴⁷ Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me hath everlasting life. (That's because Jesus is God, in the flesh. To believe on Jesus is to believe on God)

⁴⁸ I am that bread of life. (Spiritually speaking; symbolically, Jesus became the Passover lamb when they crucified Him for our sins on Passover)

⁴⁹ Your fathers did eat manna in the wilderness, and are dead. (That only kept their bodies alive, not their souls)

⁵⁰ This is the bread which cometh down from heaven, that a man may eat thereof, and not die. (God's Word is the spiritual bread that comes from heaven and gives us immortality if we accept it and follow it. Jesus became that Word to teach us in the world) **John-1:1**

⁵¹ I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever: and the bread that I will give is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world. (Ignorant Muslims and atheists try to compare Christians to cannibals. They are beyond stupid. This is a simple analogy that anyone with half a brain should be able to understand. They also accuse Christians of being polytheist because of the trinity teaching that the Catholic Church invented in its early years. The truth is that there is only one God. HE can manifest Himself at any time or in any form that He chooses)

⁵² The Jews therefore strove among themselves, saying, How can this man give us his flesh to eat? (These people are also pretty ignorant, although they had not yet witnessed the crucifixion of Jesus on Passover)

⁵³ Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ye have no life in you.

⁵⁴ Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day. (This analogy didn't help. It may have confused more people than it helped)

⁵⁵ For my flesh is meat indeed, and my blood is drink indeed.

⁵⁶ He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, dwelleth in me, and I in him.

⁵⁷ As the living Father hath sent me, and I live by the Father: so he that eateth me, even he shall live by me. (Since Jesus was the Living Word of God – this verse means that he that partakes and absorbs the Word of God will live in God's grace and salvation)

⁵⁸ This is that bread which came down from heaven: not as your fathers did eat manna, and are dead: he that eateth of this bread shall live for ever.

⁵⁹ These things said he in the synagogue, as he taught in Capernaum.

⁶⁰ Many therefore of his disciples, when they had heard this, said, This is an hard saying; who can hear it? (Because most people will not understand it, unless they know that this refers to God's Word, not Jesus' flesh body)

⁶¹ When Jesus knew in himself that his disciples murmured at it, he said unto them, Doth this offend you?

⁶² What and if ye shall see the Son of man ascend up where he was before? (They would later see Jesus resurrect and ascend into heaven)

⁶³ It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life. (God's Word is eternal life. You have to think spiritually to understand)

⁶⁴ But there are some of you that believe not. For Jesus knew from the beginning who they were that believed not, and who should betray him. (The Kenites, Judas, etc...)

⁶⁵ And he said, Therefore said I unto you, that no man can come unto me, except it were given unto him of my Father. (These are the Elect who were chosen in the First Age. They were given to Jesus to perform His work in this world)

⁶⁶ From that time many of his disciples went back, and walked no more with him. (They didn't understand what Jesus was teaching. Possibly, Jesus made this deep teaching to get rid of the ones that were only there for a fish sandwich. Every spiritual teacher will inadvertently draw cultists; people who look to join one cult or another)

⁶⁷ Then said Jesus unto the twelve, Will ye also go away? (HE is testing them)

⁶⁸ Then Simon Peter answered him, Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life. (They had seen His miracles and believed Jesus. The alternative is to go to Satan and death. They understood that)

⁶⁹ And we believe and are sure that thou art that Christ, the Son of the living God. (God, begotten in the flesh) (Christ = Christos <Greek> = the anointed One)

⁷⁰ Jesus answered them, Have not I chosen you twelve, and one of you is a devil?

⁷¹ He spake of Judas Iscariot the son of Simon: for he it was that should betray him, being one of the twelve. (God knows what we are thinking)

(Judas carried the money bag for the 12. He was the banker. He thought that Jesus would become King of the world and he would be the world banker. When he betrayed Jesus, he thought that he could force the issue and Jesus would take over as King. When that didn't happen, he repented and threw the 30 pieces of silver back at the Kenite priests. They couldn't afford to have any witnesses to what they had done, so they murdered Judas) Acts-1:18-21
