

1 Chronicles 20

King James Version (KJV)

(With their defeat of the Edomite, the moabites and the Sirians, Israel grew in land area, power and wealth. David, like any other man, is beginning to realize his own "greatness". This is a flaw in all of us. Satan is always there, waiting to take advantage of our flaws. David will be tempted and will fail in this chapter. Afterwards, there will always be trouble in his kingdom)

20 And it came to pass, that after the year was expired, at the time that kings go out to battle, Joab led forth the power of the army, and wasted the country of the children of Ammon, and came and besieged Rabbah. But David tarried at Jerusalem. And Joab smote Rabbah, and destroyed it. (The insult to David and his emissaries was repaid. Bad advice to a leader can lead a country to ruin. In this case, it destroyed Ammon)

(The year began at the spring equinox. This is the battle where David set up Uriah to be killed in battle, to cover his adulterous affair with Uriah's wife, Bathsheba. The penalty for adultery at that time was death) 2Samuel-11:1-27

²And David took the crown of their king from off his head, and found it to weigh a talent of gold, and there were precious stones in it; and it was set upon David's head: and he brought also exceeding much spoil out of the city. (Joab sent for David at the end of the battle, so that David would be the man that defeated the Ammonites. This was customary at the time. Joab was always loyal to David) 2Samuel-12:28

³And he brought out the people that were in it, and cut them with saws, and with harrows of iron, and with axes. Even so dealt David with all the cities of the children of Ammon. And David and all the people returned to Jerusalem. (Bad translation – he put them under saws, harrows and axes – he made them do forced labor as servants, with saws and harrows, etc...) 2Sanuel-12:31

2Samuel-12:10 (After David had Uriah killed in the battle, his house became one turmoil after another. God punished David for what he had done < the sword would never depart from David's house>. It was at this time that David's son, Amnon raped his half sister Tamar. Tamar's brother Absalom killed Amnon for it. Absalom fled for his life. He would later return and lead a rebellion against David)

⁴And it came to pass after this, that there arose war at Gezer with the Philistines; at which time Sibbechai the Hushathite slew Sippai, that was of the children of the giant: and they were subdued. **2Samuel-21** (The place was Gob, a suburb of Gezer) (giant = Rafa – a hybrid child of the fallen angels, and the daughters of Adam – also called Geeber. They produced freak giants who mixed with the Canaanites. God sentenced them to death. That is why God gave their land to Israel)

⁵And there was war again with the Philistines; and Elhanan the son of Jair slew Lahmi the brother of Goliath the Gittite, whose spear staff was like a weaver's beam. (22-26 ft in length) (Goliath and his brother Lahmi were giant offspring of the fallen angels. David killed Goliath in his early days)

⁶And yet again there was war at Gath, where was a man of great stature, whose fingers and toes were four and twenty, six on each hand, and six on each foot and he also was the son of the giant. (They were deformed, hybrid offspring of the fallen angels and flesh women. The fallen angels were sentenced to death by God for having done this. They will all die the instant that Messiah returns at the Second Advent) see Genesis-6 and Jude-1:6

⁷But when he defied Israel, Jonathan the son of Shimea David's brother slew him.

⁸These were born unto the giant in Gath; and they fell by the hand of David, and by the hand of his servants. (These giants were the offspring of the fallen angels, who mated with the daughters of Adam) See Jude, and Genesis-6
