King James Version (KJV)

- **68** Let God arise, let his enemies be scattered: let them also that hate him flee before him. (Almost the exact words of Moses)
- ²As smoke is driven away, so drive them away: as wax melteth before the fire, so let the wicked perish at the presence of God. 2Peter-3:10
- ³ But let the righteous be glad; let them rejoice before God: yea, let them exceedingly rejoice.
- ⁴Sing unto God, sing praises to his name: extol him that <u>rideth</u> upon the heavens by his name <u>JAH</u>, and rejoice before him. (<u>Jah</u>= YAH the saacred name of God) (rideth= as in a chariot)
- ⁵ A father of the fatherless, and a judge of the widows, is God in his holy habitation. (Father of all, defender of the helpless)
- ⁶God setteth the solitary in families: he bringeth out those which are bound with chains: but the rebellious dwell in a dry land.
- ⁷O God, when thou wentest forth before thy people, when thou didst march through the wilderness; Selah: (Exodus from Egypt Cloud by day, pillar of fire by night)
- ⁸The earth shook, the <u>heavens also dropped</u> at the presence of God: even <u>Sinai</u> itself was moved at the presence of God, the God of Israel. (heavens also dropped God provides the rain for prosperity and for protection) See Judges-5:4-5 as second witness. (Sinai when God gave Moses the 10 commandments)
- ⁹Thou, O God, didst send a plentiful rain, whereby thou didst confirm thine inheritance, when it was weary.
- ¹⁰ Thy congregation hath dwelt therein: thou, O God, hast prepared of thy goodness for the poor.
- ¹¹The Lord gave the word: great was the company of those that <u>published</u> it. (published= publish and also announce publically)
- ¹² <u>Kings of armies did flee apace</u>: and she that tarried at home divided the spoil. (Kings of the heathen armies did flee, did flee -> twice for emphasis... true translation) (she the wife of the victor)

- ¹³ Though ye have <u>lien among the pots</u>, yet shall ye be as the wings of a dove covered with silver, and her feathers with yellow gold. (lien among the pots-> area between the brick kilns in Egypt. To lay there in a dirty place, God cleans you and glorifies you as the dove example)
- ¹⁴ When the Almighty scattered kings in it, it was white as snow in <u>Salmon</u>. (Salmon- a hill near Sheckem) (When the Kings fled, they dropped everything and ran. The spoil looked like snow on the ground)
- ¹⁵ The hill of God is as the hill of Bashan; an high hill as the hill of Bashan. (Bashan symbolic of big)
- ¹⁶ Why leap ye, ye high hills? this is the hill which God desireth to dwell in; yea, the LORD will dwell in it for ever. (Zion, where God dwells, is higher than the hills of Bashan)
- ¹⁷The chariots of God are twenty thousand, even thousands of angels: the Lord is among them, as in Sinai, in the holy place. (Also see 2Kings-6:17 when Elisha asked God to open the heavens and reveal His army to Elisha's armor bearer when they were surrounded by the enemy.)
- ¹⁸Thou hast ascended on high, thou hast led captivity captive: thou hast received gifts for men; yea, for the rebellious also, that the LORD God might dwell among them. See 1Peter-3:19
- ¹⁹ Blessed be the Lord, who daily loadeth us with <u>benefits</u>, even the God of our salvation. Selah. (benefits= gifts, blessings)
- ²⁰ He that is our God is the God of salvation; and unto GoD the Lord belong the issues from death. (issues= deliverance)
- ²¹ But <u>God shall wound the head of his enemies</u>, and the <u>hairy scalp</u> of such an one as goeth on still in his trespasses. <u>Genesis-3:15</u> (hairy scalp means an arrogant, egotistical crown on the head of His enemies)
- ²²The Lord said, I will bring again from Bashan, I will bring *my people* again from the depths of the sea: (my people added by the translators. It doesn't belong.) (The Hebrew verse really means I will bring my enemies from the depths of the see <for judgement>. There is no place for them to hide)

- ²³ That <u>thy</u> foot may be dipped in the blood of thine enemies, and the tongue of thy dogs in the same. (thy- the elect of God)
- ²⁴They have seen thy goings, O God; even the goings of my God, my King, in the sanctuary.
- ²⁵ The singers went before, the players on instruments followed after; among them were the damsels playing with timbrels. (When they brought the Ark into Jerusalem) 2Samuel-6 (David also danced)
- ²⁶ Bless ye God in the congregations, even the Lord, <u>from</u> the <u>fountain</u> of Israel. (from-> Ye that are of) (Fountain- could be the twelve patriarchs of Israel)
- ²⁷ There is little Benjamin with their ruler, the princes of Judah and their council, the princes of Zebulun, and the princes of Naphtali. (The farthest south and the farthest north means ALL of Israel)
- ²⁸ Thy God hath commanded thy strength: strengthen, O God, that which thou hast wrought for us.
- ²⁹ Because of thy temple at Jerusalem shall kings bring presents unto thee. Revelation-21:20-24
- ³⁰ Rebuke the company of spearmen, the multitude of the bulls, with the calves of the people, till every one submit himself with pieces of silver: scatter thou the people that delight in war. (company of spearmen-> beasts of the reeds <Egypt> ... Bad translation)
- ³¹ Princes shall come out of Egypt; Ethiopia shall soon stretch out her hands unto God. (in prayer)
- ³² Sing unto God, ye kingdoms of the earth; O sing praises unto the Lord; Selah:
- ³³ To him that rideth upon the heavens of heavens, which were of old; lo, he doth send out his voice, and that a mighty voice. 2Peter-3:5-6 (In the first age)
- ³⁴ <u>Ascribe ye strength unto God</u>: his excellency is over Israel, and his strength is in the <u>clouds</u>. (Praise God for His might Moffet) (clouds=heavens)

³⁵ O God, thou art <u>terrible</u> out of thy holy places: the God of Israel is he that giveth strength and power unto his people. Blessed be God. (terrible= awesome)
