

2 Chronicles 29

King James Version (KJV)

29 Hezekiah began to reign when he was five and twenty years old, and he reigned nine and twenty years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name was Abijah, the daughter of Zechariah. (She is called Abi in 2Kings-18)

²And he did that which was right in the sight of the LORD, according to all that David his father had done. (Hezekiah is 14 generations after King David. He was one of the more righteous kings of Judah)

³He in the first year of his reign, in the first month, opened the doors of the house of the LORD, and repaired them. (He wasted no time with idols and false gods. He went to work in restoring the temple of God) 2Kings-17

⁴And he brought in the priests and the Levites, and gathered them together into the east street, (This was a wide area on the east side of the temple)

⁵And said unto them, Hear me, ye Levites, sanctify now yourselves, and sanctify the house of the LORD God of your fathers, and carry forth the filthiness out of the holy place. (Those were the idols of Ahaz and the many that followed him)

⁶For our fathers have trespassed, and done that which was evil in the eyes of the LORD our God, and have forsaken him, and have turned away their faces from the habitation of the LORD, and turned their backs. (Seek God and you'll find Him; Turn away from God and He will forsake you)

⁷Also they have shut up the doors of the porch, and put out the lamps, and have not burned incense nor offered burnt offerings in the holy place unto the God of Israel. (They used this place to make offerings to heathen idols)

⁸Wherefore the wrath of the LORD was upon Judah and Jerusalem, and he hath delivered them to trouble, to astonishment, and to hissing, as ye see with your eyes. (When Solomon dedicated the temple to God, in his prayer, he said this would happen if people turned away from the Lord)

⁹For, lo, our fathers have fallen by the sword, and our sons and our daughters and our wives are in captivity for this. (Israel has now fallen to the Assyrians; Judah has lost much territory and many cities to the Philistines, Edomites, Syrians and other invaders)

¹⁰Now it is in mine heart to make a covenant with the LORD God of Israel, that his fierce wrath may turn away from us. (Turn back to God and truly repent; and He will take you back and bless you)

¹¹My sons, be not now negligent: for the LORD hath chosen you to stand before him, to serve him, and that ye should minister unto him, and burn incense. Exodus-32:26 (God chose the Levites to serve in the temple because they all stood with Moses against the idolaters. This was the time that Aaron made them a golden calf to worship in the wilderness)

¹²Then the Levites arose, Mahath the son of Amasai, and Joel the son of Azariah, of the sons of the Kohathites: and of the sons of Merari, Kish the son of Abdi, and Azariah the son of Jehalelel: and of the Gershonites; Joah the son of Zimmah, and Eden the son of Joah: (Gershion, Merari, and Kohath – the three main families of the Levites are represented here; these are not priests but they are all Levites)

¹³And of the sons of Elizaphan; Shimri, and Jeiel: and of the sons of Asaph; Zechariah, and Mattaniah: (Asaph, a Gershonite, was one of the leaders of the musicians in David's reign; Elizaphan was the grandson of Kohath)

¹⁴And of the sons of Heman; Jehiel, and Shimei: and of the sons of Jeduthun; Shemaiah, and Uzziel. (Heman, another lead director of musicians under David)

¹⁵And they gathered their brethren, and sanctified themselves, and came, according to the commandment of the king, by the words of the LORD, to cleanse the house of the LORD. (The command of Hezekiah, but all of it was based on the law that Moses brought to them from God)

¹⁶And the priests went into the inner part of the house of the LORD, to cleanse it, and brought out all the uncleanness that they found in the temple of the LORD into the court of the house of the LORD. And the Levites took it, to carry it out abroad into the brook Kidron. (All priests were descendants of Aaron) (Kidron was a dry riverbed through most

of the year) (The priests started in the Holy of Holies, the most inner part of the temple, and cleaned outward from there)

¹⁷ Now they began on the first day of the first month to sanctify, and on the eighth day of the month came they to the porch of the LORD: so they sanctified the house of the LORD in eight days; and in the sixteenth day of the first month they made an end. (The cleaning of the temple caused the Passover to be delayed until the second month. It would have normally happened on the 14th day of the first month. The temple wasn't ready on the 14th, nor were the people)

¹⁸ Then they went in to Hezekiah the king, and said, We have cleansed all the house of the LORD, and the altar of burnt offering, with all the vessels thereof, and the shewbread table, with all the vessels thereof.

¹⁹ Moreover all the vessels, which king Ahaz in his reign did cast away in his transgression, have we prepared and sanctified, and, behold, they are before the altar of the LORD.

²⁰ Then Hezekiah the king rose early, and gathered the rulers of the city, and went up to the house of the LORD. (He was excited to put God's temple back in order)

²¹ And they brought seven bullocks, and seven rams, and seven lambs, and seven he goats, for a sin offering for the kingdom, and for the sanctuary, and for Judah. And he commanded the priests the sons of Aaron to offer them on the altar of the LORD. (They are repenting for all the idolatry that they did under King Ahaz)

²² So they killed the bullocks, and the priests received the blood, and sprinkled it on the altar: likewise, when they had killed the rams, they sprinkled the blood upon the altar: they killed also the lambs, and they sprinkled the blood upon the altar. **Leviticus-4:30-34, & 8:15**

²³ And they brought forth the he goats for the sin offering before the king and the congregation; and they laid their hands upon them: **Leviticus-4:8**

²⁴ And the priests killed them, and they made reconciliation with their blood upon the altar, to make an atonement for all Israel: for the king commanded that the burnt offering and the sin offering should be made for all Israel. (He offered repentance for all the people – the 12 tribes. Many will accept and many won't. We all make our own fate)

²⁵ And he set the Levites in the house of the LORD with cymbals, with psalteries, and with harps, according to the commandment of David, and of Gad the king's seer, and Nathan the prophet: for so was the commandment of the LORD by his prophets.

²⁶ And the Levites stood with the instruments of David, and the priests with the trumpets. **1Chronicles-15:24 & 16:6, Numbers-10**

²⁷ And Hezekiah commanded to offer the burnt offering upon the altar. And when the burnt offering began, the song of the LORD began also with the trumpets, and with the instruments ordained by David king of Israel.

²⁸ And all the congregation worshipped, and the singers sang, and the trumpeters sounded: and all this continued until the burnt offering was finished.

²⁹ And when they had made an end of offering, the king and all that were present with him bowed themselves, and worshipped. **(Worship to Yahoveh finally returned to Judah after the reign of 2 heathen kings. Hezekiah was the last righteous king of Judah)**

³⁰ Moreover Hezekiah the king and the princes commanded the Levites to sing praise unto the LORD with the words of David, and of Asaph the seer. And they sang praises with gladness, and they bowed their heads and worshipped. **(Asaph was one of three leaders of the musicians under David. They are also called seers and prophets)**

³¹ Then Hezekiah answered and said, Now ye have consecrated yourselves unto the LORD, come near and bring sacrifices and thank offerings into the house of the LORD. And the congregation brought in sacrifices and thank offerings; and as many as were of a free heart burnt offerings. **2Corinthians-9:7 (God loves a cheerful giver)**

³² And the number of the burnt offerings, which the congregation brought, was threescore and ten bullocks, an hundred rams, and two hundred lambs: all these were for a burnt offering to the LORD.

³³ And the consecrated things were six hundred oxen and three thousand sheep. **(These offerings were for a thank offering which the people would partake of. It was symbolic of sharing a meal with God)**

³⁴ But the priests were too few, so that they could not flay all the burnt offerings: wherefore their brethren the Levites did help them, till the

work was ended, and until the other priests had sanctified themselves: for the Levites were more upright in heart to sanctify themselves than the priests. (Many of the priests had been involved in idolatry under orders from Ahaz. That made them unclean to make offerings to God)

³⁵ And also the burnt offerings were in abundance, with the fat of the peace offerings, and the drink offerings for every burnt offering. So the service of the house of the LORD was set in order. Numbers-15:1-10

³⁶ And Hezekiah rejoiced, and all the people, that God had prepared the people: for the thing was done suddenly. (The temple was open, sanctified and used once again to make offerings to God. One righteous king made all the difference)

Hosea-6:6 (Today, our offerings to God are our love and worship. Jesus fulfilled all blood ordinances when they crucified Him. HE became the Passover Lamb for all time)
