

Genesis 14

King James Version (KJV)

14 And it came to pass in the days of Amraphel king of Shinar, Arioch king of Ellasar, Chedorlaomer king of Elam, and Tidal king of nations; (Shinar is Babylon)

²That these made war with Bera king of Sodom, and with Birsha king of Gomorrah, Shinab king of Admah, and Shemeber king of Zeboiim, and the king of Bela, which is Zoar. (These are the 5 cities that will be destroyed by God, when HE destroys Sodom and Gomorrah)

³All these were joined together in the vale of Siddim, which is the salt sea.

⁴Twelve years they served Chedorlaomer, and in the thirteenth year they rebelled.

⁵And in the fourteenth year came Chedorlaomer, and the kings that were with him, and smote the Rephaims in Ashteroth Karnaim, and the Zuzims in Ham, and the Emims in Shaveh Kiriathaim, (Rephaims – is a name for the fallen angels; these groups of people were evil and perverted)

⁶And the Horites in their mount Seir, unto Elparan, which is by the wilderness.

⁷And they returned, and came to Enmishpat, which is Kadesh, and smote all the country of the Amalekites, and also the Amorites, that dwelt in Hazezontamar. (The Amalekites and Amorites were also infiltrated by Kenites and Geber <giant offspring of the fallen angels>)

⁸And there went out the king of Sodom, and the king of Gomorrah, and the king of Admah, and the king of Zeboiim, and the king of Bela (the same is Zoar;) and they joined battle with them in the vale of Siddim; (6th day creation fighting this group of evil perverts, and Geber)

⁹With Chedorlaomer the king of Elam, and with Tidal king of nations, and Amraphel king of Shinar, and Arioch king of Ellasar; four kings with five.

¹⁰And the vale of Siddim was full of slimepits; and the kings of Sodom and Gomorrah fled, and fell there; and they that remained fled to the

mountain. (Sodom & Gomorrah group were defeated by the other group)

¹¹ And they took all the goods of Sodom and Gomorrah, and all their victuals, and went their way.

¹² And they took Lot, Abram's brother's son, who dwelt in Sodom, and his goods, and departed. (Lot got himself embroiled into Sodom because he lived there)

¹³ And there came one that had escaped, and told Abram the Hebrew; for he dwelt in the plain of Mamre the Amorite, brother of Eshcol, and brother of Aner: and these were confederate with Abram.

¹⁴ And when Abram heard that his brother was taken captive, he armed his trained servants, born in his own house, three hundred and eighteen, and pursued them unto Dan. (brother= relative; actually Lot was Abram's nephew)

¹⁵ And he divided himself against them, he and his servants, by night, and smote them, and pursued them unto Hobah, which is on the left hand of Damascus. (God was with Abram and his servants)

¹⁶ And he brought back all the goods, and also brought again his brother Lot, and his goods, and the women also, and the people. (Abram rescued Lot and his people and goods)

¹⁷ And the king of Sodom went out to meet him after his return from the slaughter of Chedorlaomer, and of the kings that were with him, at the valley of Shaveh, which is the king's dale. 2Samuel-18:18 (Where Absalom later built a pillar to praise himself)

¹⁸ And Melchizedek king of Salem brought forth bread and wine: and he was the priest of the most high God. Melchizedek -> Hebrews-7:1-3, Hebrews-6:20, John-8:58, (Salem = Peace) (This is Christ, thousands of years before he was born in the flesh as Jesus; HE met with Abram in a supernatural body, as Melchizedek) (HE brought bread and wine just as Jesus would, much later, when teaching the Apostles how to commune with God)

¹⁹ And he blessed him, and said, Blessed be Abram of the most high God, possessor of heaven and earth: (Jesus < as Melchizedek > blessed Abram as a man of God) (God is the possessor of Heaven and Earth, not Abram)

²⁰ And blessed be the most high God, which hath delivered thine enemies into thy hand. And he gave him tithes of all. (God gave Abram the victory. Abram only had 318 men, against 5 armies)

²¹ And the king of Sodom said unto Abram, Give me the persons, and take the goods to thyself. (As a reward for freeing them)

²² And Abram said to the king of Sodom, I have lift up mine hand unto the LORD, the most high God, the possessor of heaven and earth,

²³ That I will not take from a thread even to a shoelatchet, and that I will not take any thing that is thine, lest thou shouldest say, I have made Abram rich: (Abram took nothing because he didn't want to owe anything to these evil perverts. Also because he knew that he didn't save them, God did. Abram only went there to free Lot and his family)

²⁴ Save only that which the young men have eaten, and the portion of the men which went with me, Aner, Eshcol, and Mamre; let them take their portion.
