

BOOK II (42->72)

Psalm 42

King James Version (KJV) Mas-chil, to the sons of Ko-rah
(Maschil=instruction) (probably written by a Levite)

42 As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God. (brooks= a river at the bottom of a steep gorge – difficult to get to)

² My soul thirsteth for God, for the living God: when shall I come and appear before God?

³ My tears have been my meat day and night, while they continually say unto me, Where is thy God? (Prophetically -> when the elect are delivered up, the followers of antichrist will say this)

⁴ When I remember these things, I pour out my soul in me: for I had gone with the multitude, I went with them to the house of God, with the voice of joy and praise, with a multitude that kept holyday.

⁵ Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted in me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise him for the help of his countenance. (cast= bowed) (disquieted= upset, stirred up)

⁶ O my God, my soul is cast down within me: therefore will I remember thee from the land of Jordan, and of the Hermonites, from the hill Mizar. (Hermonites -> two peaks in Israel, east of the Jordan)

⁷ Deep calleth unto deep at the noise of thy waterspouts: all thy waves and thy billows are gone over me. (waterspouts= waterfalls) (waves of trouble flow over him)

⁸ Yet the LORD will command his lovingkindness in the day time, and in the night his song shall be with me, and my prayer unto the God of my life.

⁹ I will say unto God my rock, Why hast thou forgotten me? why go I mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?

¹⁰ As with a sword in my bones, mine enemies reproach me; while they say daily unto me, Where is thy God? See verse 3.

¹¹ Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise him, who is the health of my countenance, and my God. (health= Yeshua in the Hebrew texts, wjich means -> Jesus)

Korah challenged Moses as leader of the Israelites. God killed Korah. Korathites were Levitical musicians in the temple.
