

2 Chronicles 33

King James Version (KJV)

33 Manasseh was twelve years old when he began to reign, and he reigned fifty and five years in Jerusalem: (Manasseh means forgetting; his reign was the longest in Judah)

² But did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD, like unto the abominations of the heathen, whom the LORD had cast out before the children of Israel. (Like the Canaanites) Deuteronomy-18:9

³ For he built again the high places which Hezekiah his father had broken down, and he reared up altars for Baalim, and made groves, and worshipped all the host of heaven, and served them.
Deuteronomy-4:19 (Told them not to worship the heavens. Many heathen nations did that in ancient days)

⁴ Also he built altars in the house of the LORD, whereof the LORD had said, In Jerusalem shall my name be for ever.

⁵ And he built altars for all the host of heaven in the two courts of the house of the LORD. (He defiled the temple of God)

⁶ And he caused his children to pass through the fire in the valley of the son of Hinnom: also he observed times, and used enchantments, and used witchcraft, and dealt with a familiar spirit, and with wizards: he wrought much evil in the sight of the LORD, to provoke him to anger. (Sacrificing his children by fire to the heathen god Molech) (He also used psychics, witches, necromancers and fortune tellers) 2Kings-21

⁷ And he set a carved image, the idol which he had made, in the house of God, of which God had said to David and to Solomon his son, In this house, and in Jerusalem, which I have chosen before all the tribes of Israel, will I put my name for ever: (carved image- a phallic symbol)

⁸ Neither will I any more remove the foot of Israel from out of the land which I have appointed for your fathers; so that they will take heed to do all that I have commanded them, according to the whole law and the statutes and the ordinances by the hand of Moses. 2Samuel-7:10
(God made this promise IF the Israelites would walk in the ways of God. They didn't, so they lost God's promise)

⁹ So Manasseh made Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem to err, and to do worse than the heathen, whom the LORD had destroyed before the children of Israel. (He made Judah worse than the Canaanites who had preceded them)

¹⁰ And the LORD spake to Manasseh, and to his people: but they would not hearken. (God sent them many prophets)

¹¹ Wherefore the LORD brought upon them the captains of the host of the king of Assyria, which took Manasseh among the thorns, and bound him with fetters, and carried him to Babylon. (thorns = hooks)

(A monument has been found showing King Azar-haddan leading two captives with hooks or rings in their lips. The inscription reads – I counted among the vassals in my realm, 12 kings of Syria, Baloo, king of Tyre, and Manasseh, king of Judah)

¹² And when he was in affliction, he besought the LORD his God, and humbled himself greatly before the God of his fathers, (He repented, and God heard him)

(If you seek the Lord, HE will be found of you. If God can forgive that evil king for all that he did, he can forgive us for our sins)

¹³ And prayed unto him: and he was intreated of him, and heard his supplication, and brought him again to Jerusalem into his kingdom. Then Manasseh knew that the LORD he was God. (In the Apocrypha, there is a book called the Prayer of Manasseh)

¹⁴ Now after this he built a wall without the city of David, on the west side of Gihon, in the valley, even to the entering in at the fish gate, and compassed about Ophel, and raised it up a very great height, and put captains of war in all the fenced cities of Judah. (He fortified the cities of Judah)

¹⁵ And he took away the strange gods, and the idol out of the house of the LORD, and all the altars that he had built in the mount of the house of the LORD, and in Jerusalem, and cast them out of the city. (He got rid of all the idols he had put in Jerusalem. His son Amon will later find these idols and start worshipping them again)

¹⁶ And he repaired the altar of the LORD, and sacrificed thereon peace offerings and thank offerings, and commanded Judah to serve

the LORD God of Israel. Jeremiah-15:4, 2Kings-24:3 (God cast Judah out of His sight because of the sins of Manasseh)

¹⁷ Nevertheless the people did sacrifice still in the high places, yet unto the LORD their God only. (Although this was worship to Yahoveh and not to idols, it was still wrong. God said only to worship in the temple)

¹⁸ Now the rest of the acts of Manasseh, and his prayer unto his God, and the words of the seers that spake to him in the name of the LORD God of Israel, behold, they are written in the book of the kings of Israel.

¹⁹ His prayer also, and how God was intreated of him, and all his sins, and his trespass, and the places wherein he built high places, and set up groves and graven images, before he was humbled: behold, they are written among the sayings of the seers. (Apocrapha – The prayer of Manasseh)

²⁰ So Manasseh slept with his fathers, and they buried him in his own house: and Amon his son reigned in his stead. Septuagint & 2Kings-21:18 (They buried him in the garden of his house. He didn't deserve to be buried in the sepulcher of the kings)

²¹ Amon was two and twenty years old when he began to reign, and reigned two years in Jerusalem.

²² But he did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD, as did Manasseh his father: for Amon sacrificed unto all the carved images which Manasseh his father had made, and served them; (He brought them back from the valley of Kidron)

²³ And humbled not himself before the LORD, as Manasseh his father had humbled himself; but Amon trespassed more and more.

²⁴ And his servants conspired against him, and slew him in his own house. 2Kings-21:26 (They wanted to get rid of yet another evil king. He was buried in the garden with his father Manasseh. Nothing else is written about Amon. He wasn't worth writing about)

²⁵ But the people of the land slew all them that had conspired against king Amon; and the people of the land made Josiah his son king in his stead. (Josiah had been prophesied 360 years before, in the time of Jeroboam. He was the last righteous king of Judah)
