## **Psalm 84** A Psalm for the sons of Ko-rah King James Version (KJV)

- **84** How <u>amiable</u> are thy tabernacles, O LORD of hosts! (amiable= lovable) (at this time, one tabernacle at Gibeon, one at Jerusalem)
- <sup>2</sup>My soul longeth, yea, even fainteth for the courts of the LORD: my heart and my flesh crieth out for the living God.
- <sup>3</sup>Yea, the sparrow hath found an house, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, even thine altars, O LORD of hosts, my King, and my God.
- <sup>4</sup>Blessed are they that dwell in thy house: they will be still praising thee. Selah. (Selah means to pause and meditate)
- <sup>5</sup> Blessed is the man whose strength is in thee; in whose heart are the ways of them.
- <sup>6</sup> Who passing through the valley of <u>Baca</u> make it a well; the rain also filleth the pools. (Baca= weeping) (people passed through this valley on their way to the tabernacle to worship on the three holidays. This was a place to stop and refresh themselves)
- They go from strength to strength, every one of them in Zion appeareth before God. (Every one of them was added by translators) (strength to strength -> stop to stop as they travel to Zion)
- \*O LORD God of hosts, hear my prayer: give ear, O God of Jacob. Selah.
- Behold, O God our shield, and look upon the face of thine anointed. (The king was called God's anointed... also prophetically, the Elect)
- <sup>10</sup> For a day in <u>thy courts</u> is better than a thousand. I had rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God, than to dwell in the tents of wickedness. (thy courts the sanctuary)
- <sup>11</sup> For the LORD God is a sun and shield: the LORD will give grace and glory: no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly. (Both the Light of the world and our shield against the wicked one)
- <sup>12</sup>O LORD of hosts, blessed is the man that trusteth in thee.
