Matthew 6

King James Version (KJV)

- **6** Take heed that ye do not your alms before men, to be seen of them: otherwise ye have no reward of your Father which is in heaven. (These are people who put on a show, in front of others, to brag about how "generous" they are)
- ²Therefore when thou doest thine alms, do not sound a trumpet before thee, as the <u>hypocrites</u> do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may have glory of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. (hypocrites= stage actors, play actors) (Their inflated ego and self pride is their reward. God won't give them any more reward)
- ³ But when thou doest alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth. (A gift to God is a private affair between you and God)
- ⁴That thine alms may be in secret: and thy Father which seeth in secret himself shall reward thee openly.
- ⁵ And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the <u>hypocrites</u> are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. (hypocrites= play actors; looking "so holy")
- ⁶ But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly. (Don't put on a show for others)
- ⁷But when ye pray, <u>use not vain repetitions</u>, <u>as the heathen</u> do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking. (as the muslims do) 1Kings-18:25-26
- ⁸Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him.
- ⁹ After this manner therefore pray ye: Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. (Pray to the Father; Jesus was God in the flesh, just a part of the Father Himself)
- ¹⁰ Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven.

- ¹¹ Give us this day our daily bread. (In the Greek manuscripts, this is a unique saying that is reminiscent of the manna that the Israelites received in the wilderness. Spiritually, the manna from God today, is His Word, taught to us every day)
- ¹² And forgive us our <u>debts</u>, as we forgive our <u>debtors</u>. (debts= faults or trespasses against others) (debtors= those who do us wrong)
- ¹³ And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from <u>evil</u>: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen. (evil = the evil one Septuagint translation)
- ¹⁴ For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you: (This also means to forgive yourself when you make a mistake. You are not better than anyone else)
- ¹⁵ But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.
- ¹⁶ Moreover when ye fast, be not, as the hypocrites, of a sad countenance: for they disfigure their faces, that they may appear unto men to fast. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. (Their self-pity, ego-boosting show is their only reward)
- ¹⁷ But thou, when thou fastest, anoint thine head, and wash thy face; (Don't look like a victim)
- ¹⁸ That thou appear not unto men to fast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly.
- ¹⁹ Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: Ecclesiastes-1&2
- ²⁰ But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal:
- ²¹ For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.
- ²²The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be <u>single</u>, thy whole body shall be full of light. (single= clear, bright) (The eye mirrors the soul)

- ²³ But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness! (You can't see he truth)
- ²⁴ No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and <u>mammon</u>. (mammon= riches or wealth not earned honestly- ill gotten gains)
- ²⁵ Therefore I say unto you, Take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment? (Plan your life; don't waste time worrying about it)
- ²⁶ Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they?
- ²⁷ Which of you by taking thought can add one cubit unto his stature? (Worrying won't add one second to your life)
- ²⁸ And why take ye thought for raiment? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin:
- ²⁹ And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.
- ³⁰ Wherefore, if God so clothe the grass of the field, which to day is, and to morrow is cast into the oven, shall he not much more clothe you, O ye of little faith?
- ³¹ Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed?
- ³² (For after all these things do the <u>Gentiles</u> seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. (Gentiles- the nations of unbelievers and heathen)
- ³³ <u>But seek ye first the kingdom of God</u>, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. (<u>Make an effort</u> to find it, and <u>God will reward you</u>)

³⁴ Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof. (Take care of today, and don't worry about tomorrow)
