Joshua 8

King James Version (KJV)

- **8** And the LORD said unto Joshua, Fear not, neither be thou dismayed: take all the people of war with thee, and arise, go up to Ai: see, <u>I have given into thy hand the king of Ai</u>, and his people, and his city, and his land: (This time, God will be with them, against Ai. HE will give Israel the victory)
- ²And thou shalt do to Ai and her king as thou didst unto Jericho and her king: only the spoil thereof, and the cattle thereof, shall ye take for a prey unto yourselves: lay thee an ambush for the city behind it. (This time the people will keep the spoils)
- ³So Joshua arose, and all the people of war, to go up against Ai: and Joshua chose out thirty thousand mighty men of valour, and sent them away by night.
- ⁴And he commanded them, saying, Behold, ye shall lie in wait against the city, even behind the city: go not very far from the city, but be ye all ready: (They will wait there until the signal is given to ambush Ai)
- ⁵ And I, and all the people that are with me, will approach unto the city: and it shall come to pass, when they come out against us, as at the first, that we will flee before them, (To draw them away from the city)
- ⁶ (For they will come out after us) till we have drawn them from the city; for they will say, They flee before us, as at the first: therefore we will flee before them.
- ⁷Then ye shall rise up from the ambush, and seize upon the city: for the LORD your God will deliver it into your hand. (While the army is out chasing Joshua, the city will be easy to take)
- ⁸ And it shall be, when ye have taken the city, that ye shall set the city on fire: according to the commandment of the LORD shall ye do. See, I have commanded you. (They will take the spoils, and then burn the city)
- ⁹ Joshua therefore sent them forth: and they went to lie in ambush, and abode between <u>Bethel and Ai</u>, on the west side of Ai: but Joshua lodged that night among the people. (Bethel = the house of God; Ai = a heap)

- ¹⁰ And Joshua rose up early in the morning, and numbered the people, and went up, he and the elders of Israel, before the people to Ai.
- ¹¹ And all the people, even the people of war that were with him, went up, and drew nigh, and came before the city, and pitched on the north side of Ai: now there was a valley between them and Ai. (That would give them a head start when they ran from the people of Ai)
- ¹² And he took about five thousand men, and set them to lie in ambush between Bethel and Ai, on the west side of the city. (They have Ai surrounded, but Ai doesn't know it)
- ¹³ And when they had set the people, even all the host that was on the north of the city, and their liers in wait on the west of the city, Joshua went that night into the midst of the valley.
- ¹⁴ And it came to pass, when the king of Ai saw it, that they hasted and rose up early, and the men of the city went out against Israel to battle, he and all his people, at a time appointed, before the plain; but he wist not that there were liers in ambush against him behind the city. (They were overconfident because they had beaten Israel in the last battle)
- ¹⁵ And Joshua and all Israel made as if they were beaten before them, and fled by the way of the wilderness. (They are running away from Ai, drawing Ai's army out after them)
- ¹⁶ And all the people that were in Ai were called together to pursue after them: and they pursued after Joshua, and were drawn away from the city. (Now they are out in the open, and surrounded. Meanwhile the city is open and unprotected)
- ¹⁷ And there was not a man left in Ai or Bethel, that went not out after Israel: and they left the city open, and pursued after Israel. (The people of Bethel joined in the battle, on Ai's side. They will also lose)
- ¹⁸ And the LORD said unto Joshua, Stretch out the spear that is in thy hand toward Ai; for I will give it into thine hand. And Joshua stretched out the spear that he had in his hand toward the city. (This was the signal for the troops to attack Ai)
- ¹⁹ And the ambush arose quickly out of their place, and they ran as soon as he had stretched out his hand: and they entered into the city,

and took it, and hasted and set the city on fire. (The men of Ai had no place left to retreat to)

- ²⁰ And when the men of Ai looked behind them, they saw, and, behold, the smoke of the city ascended up to heaven, and they had no power to flee this way or that way: and the people that fled to the wilderness turned back upon the pursuers. (The Israelites that they were chasing turned back on them and charged)
- ²¹ And when Joshua and all Israel saw that the ambush had taken the city, and that the smoke of the city ascended, then they turned again, and slew the men of Ai. (The army of Ai had no chance. They were out in the open and surrounded)
- ²² And the other issued out of the city against them; so they were in the midst of Israel, some on this side, and some on that side: and they smote them, so that they let none of them remain or escape.
- ²³ And the king of Ai they took alive, and brought him to Joshua.
- ²⁴ And it came to pass, when Israel had made an end of slaying all the inhabitants of Ai in the field, in the wilderness wherein they chased them, and when they were all fallen on the edge of the sword, until they were consumed, that all the Israelites returned unto Ai, and smote it with the edge of the sword. (God ordered them to totally destroy the heathen tribes of the Promised Land. They were judged for their idolatry and their perversion)

(God will only tolerate sin and perversion from a society for so long; and then His patience runs out. We need to wake up, expel perversion, atheism and islam; and return to God as a Christian country; or we will be judged, like Ai was)

- ²⁵ And so it was, that all that fell that day, both of men and women, were twelve thousand, even all the men of Ai. (These souls returned to paradise as we all do upon death. They will get an opportunity to learn and repent during the Millennium. If they do, they will live forever with God in the eternity <the Third Age>)
- ²⁶ For Joshua drew not his hand back, wherewith he stretched out the spear, until he had utterly destroyed all the inhabitants of Ai. (He did as God ordered)

- ²⁷Only the cattle and the spoil of that city Israel took for a prey unto themselves, according unto the word of the LORD which he commanded Joshua.
- ²⁸ And Joshua burnt Ai, and made it an heap for ever, even a desolation unto this day. (Today that city is called Tell which means a heap; just as Ai did in the other language)
- ²⁹ And the king of Ai he hanged on a tree until eventide: and as soon as the sun was down, Joshua commanded that they should take his carcase down from the tree, and cast it at the entering of the gate of the city, and raise thereon a great heap of stones, that remaineth unto this day. Deuteronomy-21:22-23
- ³⁰ Then Joshua built an altar unto the LORD God of Israel in mount <u>Ebal</u>, (Ebal = a stone, a stone mountain) (Joshua always remembered to thank God for His blessings)
- ³¹ As Moses the servant of the LORD commanded the children of Israel, as it is written in the book of the law of Moses, <u>an altar of whole stones</u>, <u>over which no man hath lift up any iron</u>: and they offered thereon burnt offerings unto the LORD, and sacrificed peace offerings. Exodus-20:25, Revelation-2:17
- ³² And he wrote there upon the stones <u>a copy of the law of Moses</u>, which he wrote in the presence of the children of Israel. (He wrote out the Ten Commandments)
- ³³ And all Israel, and their elders, and officers, and their judges, stood on this side the ark and on that side before the priests the Levites, which bare the ark of the covenant of the LORD, as well the stranger, as he that was born among them; half of them over against mount Gerizim, and half of them over against mount Ebal; as Moses the servant of the LORD had commanded before, that they should bless the people of Israel.
- ³⁴ And afterward he read all the words of the law, the <u>blessings and cursings</u>, according to all that is written in the book of the law. (God doesn't curse people. If you defy God, He will allow the curses of the world to come down upon you. You have the choice)

(They worshipped God by reading His Word to the people; not by having a "service & a sermon" written by men. Churches, today,

should learn from this. People today are lucky if the preacher reads one or two verses of God's Word during their services)

³⁵ There was not a word of all that Moses commanded, which Joshua read not before all the congregation of Israel, with the women, and the little ones, and the strangers that were conversant among them. (He read the entire Book, chapter by chapter, verse by verse. He didn't write a sermon; like we see so many ignorant preachers do today)
